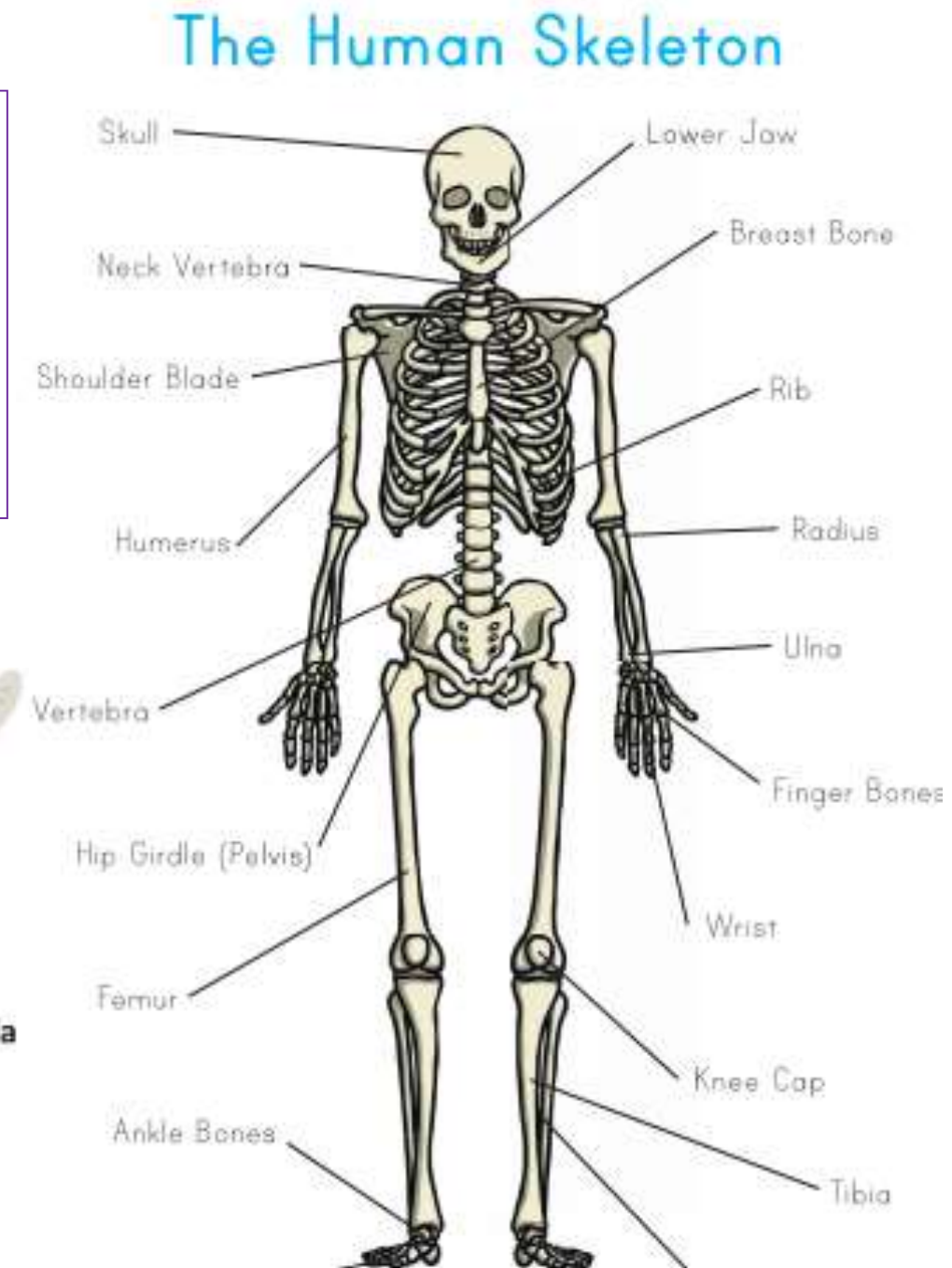
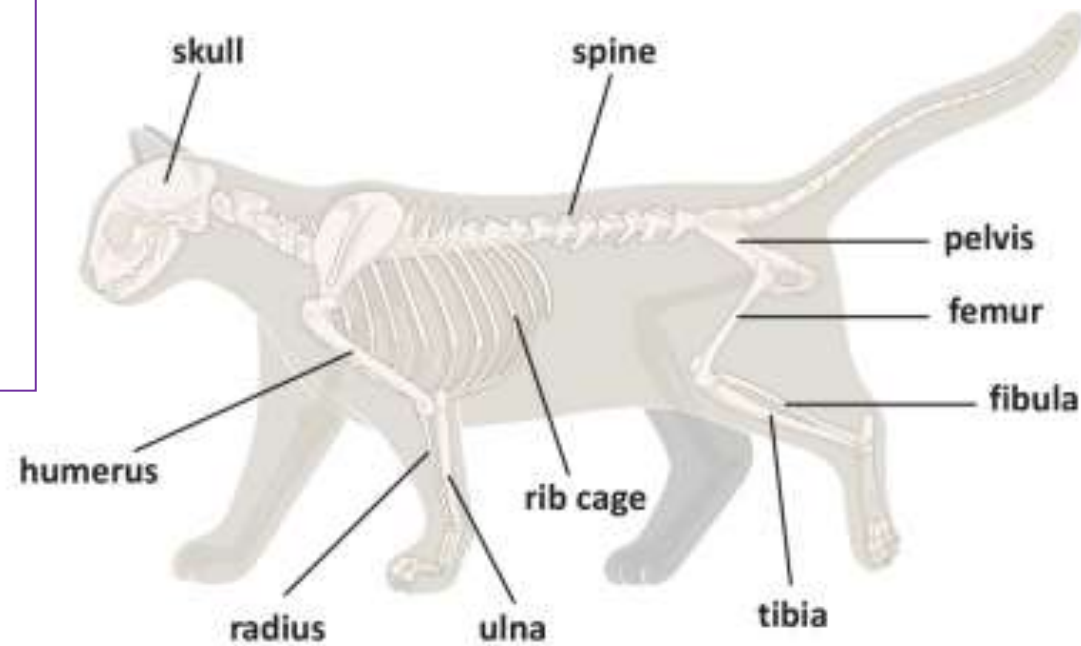

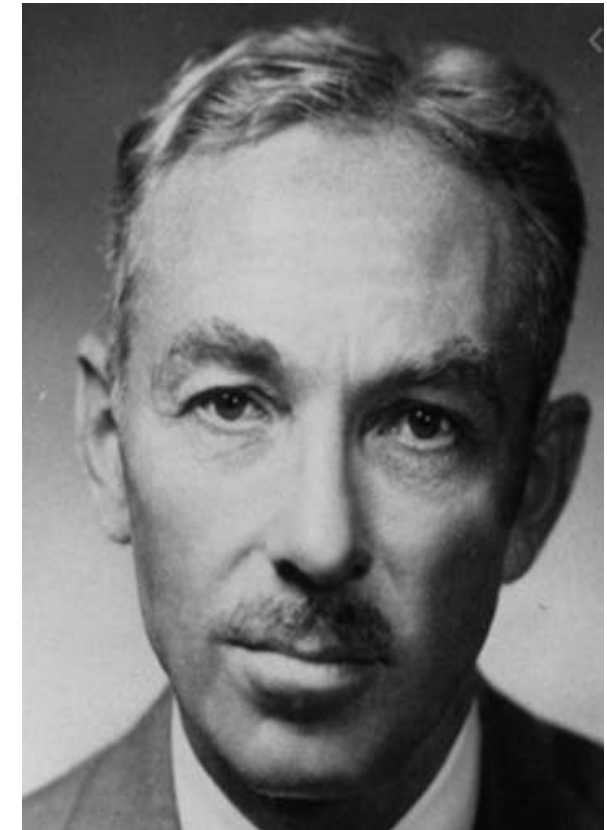

**Habitat** – A place that an animal lives. It provides the animal with food, water and shelter.

**Food chain** – A food chain shows how each living things gets food, and how nutrients and energy are passed from creature to creature.

**Predators** – A predator is wild animal, which hunts or preys on other animals for food. They feed on the flesh of animals to survive. Examples of predators include Lions, cheetahs, foxes, snakes and polar bears.

**Prey** – An animal that is hunted and killed by another for food.

**Parasite** – A living thing that live sin or on another living things and gets food and sometimes shelter from it.

**Herbivore** – Animals that only eat plants. Herbivores have teeth that are adapted to grind vegetable tissue. E.g. Deer, elephants and horses.

**Carnivore** – An animal, which eats mostly meat. Predators mostly hunt ad kill their own prey.
